Course Description

This course is designed to acquaint students pursuing science and medical careers with the origins of technical terms they are likely to encounter. The focus of the class will be an introduction to the component parts of scientific and medical terms including prefixes, suffixes, and word roots. You will become familiar with body structure and function, and as a result be able to describe the terms that define human body systems.

Evaluation Methods

Your final grade will be based on your performance on the following:

Pronounce

Each lesson will have an exercise in pronunciation. Cengage has a fantastic tool that allows users to practice pronouncing medical terms. It is very forgiving and easy to use. You will practice your pronunciation skills with 15 unique terms in each chapter.

This assignment is worth 11.25% of your grade.

Practice Quiz

Each Lesson will have a link to a practice quiz on the Cengage website. You may retake the quiz as many times as you like to improve your score. This tool will prepare you for the graded quiz at the end of each lesson (see below). Each lesson's Practice Quiz is worth 25 points.

This assignment is worth 18.75% of your grade.

Quizzes

Each Lesson ends with the completion of a timed quiz. Each quiz has a total of 22 questions: 2 five-part matching questions, 10 multiple choice questions, and 10 fill-in-the-blank questions. The quiz questions for each Lesson will cover the terms from the chapter covered within that Lesson. You will have 25 minutes to complete the quiz. You may use your textbook and notes, but you may not consult with another person during the quiz. There is only one attempt for each quiz.

This assignment is worth 45% of your grade.

Summative Assessments

At the end of every 3 lessons, there is a summative assessment that puts a few of the terms you have learned into context. You will read a short case study that has three terms from the previous three lessons. You will look up additional information on the medical condition highlighted in the case study, then provide an oral and written summary of the diagnosis in plain language. This assessment will test your understanding of the terminology in context and prepare you for the format of the final exam.

This assignment is worth 10% of your grade.



Exam Method: Online without proctoring

After you have completed all 15 Lessons, you will end the course by taking an online exam. The exam is open note; however, you must take the exam alone. You will have 100 minutes to identify and describe 50 medical terms covered in the Lessons of this course within the text of 10 medical case studies. You will receive one attempt on each exam.

This assignment is worth 15% of your grade.
