Evaluation Methods

Self Assessment Activities (0%)

Self Assessment activities don't have impact on your final grades. Those activities are formative. They give you the opportunity to evaluate yourself and practice as much as you want before taking a Quiz. This formative assessment is an open book evaluation.

Quizzes (50%)

Quizzes evaluate the 4 competencies (speaking, listening, writing and reading) are assigned with each lesson of this course and cumulatively account for 50% of your final course grade. The quizzes are open book.

Oral Presentation (15%)

The Oral Presentation account for 15% of your final course grade.

Exams (35%)

A midcourse exam that reviews the first half of the course will account for 15% of your final course grade. A second exam that reviews the second half of the course will account for 20% of your final course grade. The exams are open book.
