

U400-347: INTRODUCTION À LA CIVILISATION FRANÇAISE

Prerequisites: Completion of U400-204 Fourth Semester French with a C or better or the equivalent

Course Level: Intermediate; Appropriate for second-year or higher college students.

Course Description: Interested in a comprehensive survey of French history and culture from prehistoric times to the revolution? If so, Introduction à la Civilisation Française is for you. You will study the Gauls, the Romans, the Wars of Religion, the Renaissance, and the French Revolution. You will learn about rulers such as Clovis, Charlemagne, Louis XIV, and Napoleon. Investigate political and social events, constitutional developments, economic changes, religious conflicts, intellectual history, and art and literary developments. This course has 11 units, 11 assignments and 2 exams. Students will complete most assignment activities in French and have the option of completing all work in French.

- Compare historical, cultural and social aspects of France with those of their culture of origin.

Evaluation Methods

Your final grade will be based on your performance on the following:

- 1. Written Assignments (60%)
- 2. Exams (40%)

Written Assignments (60%)

Each written assignment has three parts:

- 1. Choice of identifications
- 2. Choice of short (one or two pages) essays
- 3. Selection of exercises in textbook

You have the option of writing all your identification responses and essays in French, but you must write at least three identifications and one essay in French in each lesson. You also have exercises to write in French.

Exams (40%)

This course has two proctored exams, each worth 20% of your course grade: a two-hour midterm examination after Unit 5 and a two-hour final exam after Unit 11.

Exam Method: Online without Proctoring

This course requires all students to complete exams online. Students receive two attempts on each exam. If you elect to take a second attempt, the average score of both exams will be recorded.
